NEW THIS YEAR! Clean Up Day will begin earlier at 6AM and go through 2PM. Each utility account will be limited to 2 free loads during the day. If a resident has more than 2 loads to bring, each additional load will cost \$20 - cash only. Truckloads containing loose materials and/or debris must be covered. Please bring a copy of your utility bill and/or your I.D. for proof of residency. Don't forget! The Town of Firestone would greatly appreciate your non-perishable food item donation on Clean Up Day. All food gifts will be donated to local food banks. Join us for a FREE pancake breakfast (starting at 7AM) and hamburger lunch.
